Eyes and Body	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ does not look at audience; reads notes ➤ fidgets or slouches a lot 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ makes some eye contact, but reads notes or slides most of the time ➤ fidgets or slouches a little 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ keeps eye contact with audience most of the time; only glances at notes or slides ➤ has a confident posture 	
Voice	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ speaks too quietly or not clearly ➤ does not speak appropriately for the situation (may be too informal or use slang) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ speaks loudly and clearly most of the time ➤ speaks appropriately for the situation most of the time 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ speaks loudly and clearly ➤ speaks appropriately for the situation, using formal language when appropriate
